

Medications that can cause sexual dysfunction

- antipsychotics, low desire in 50-73%
- antidepressants, low desire and orgasm problems in 30-70%,
eg: SSRI's
- cardiovascular and antihypertensive drugs, eg: beta-blockers
- histamine H2-receptor antagonists and promotility agents
- anticholinergics
- anti-androgens, eg: OCPs, GnRH agonists, danazol, and spironolactone in high doses
- narcotics
- anti-epileptics, eg: dilantin
- alcohol

Medications that can cause depression

- ACE inhibitors
- Anticonvulsants
- Antihypertensives, esp. clonidine, methyldopa, thiazides
- Antimicrobials, esp. amphotericin, ethionamide, metronidazole
- Antineoplastic drugs, esp. procarbazine, tamoxifen, vinblastine, asparaginase
- Beta-blockers
- Calcium channel blockers
- Corticosteroids
- Interferon
- Isotretinoin
- Metaclopramide
- NSAIDs, eg: indomethacin
- Sedative-hypnotics
- Sex steroids
- Statins
